Summary:

1. K-12 funding has shifted to a larger share of funding coming from the state.
2. Personal income in Colorado has increased 32% in the last 5 years, Colorado's percent of personal income spent on K-12 education has increased about one tenth (1/10th) percentage point (0.10%).
